1. Introduction

This document indicates the features/abilities of the Weigh-Comm Weighbridge solution when integrated with CathexisVision. Functionally, this integration will include the triggering of standard CathexisVision system events, based on information received from the device.

For instructions on installation or configuration of the integration, please consult the **Weigh-Comm Weighbridge Integration App-note**, available on the Cathexis website, and/or the **CathexisVision Setup Manual**.

1.1 Integration Purpose

The Weigh-Comm Weighbridge integration is a solution for vehicle weighing. This integration uses the Avery Weigh-Tronix E1105 - an advanced multi-function weight indicator, which is designed for use in industrial weighing systems. This indicator has been integrated into the CathexisVision system as a Weigh-Comm Weighbridge device, via a TCP or serial connection..

1.2 Requirements

1.2.1 General Requirements

- CathexisVision 2023.1 and later.
- Windows 10: 64-bit and later; Windows Server 2016 and later.
- Minimum of 4GB of RAM required.

1.2.2 CathexisVision License Requirements

The CathexisVision Weigh-Comm Weighbridge integration license requirements are as follows:

License	Name	Description
CWCW- 1001	Weighcomm Weighbridge	These licenses apply to the weighbridge system. The CWCW-1001 will license a single weighbridge and may be added on a weighbridge -by-weighbridge basis.
CWCW- 2000	Weighcomm Weighbridge device	This license is the "base" license to integrate with the weighbridge system. It is applied to the server to which the weighbridge device is connected. This licence will allow for the connection of a single integration device.
CWCW- 3000	Weighcomm Weighbridge bundle	This license includes one CWCW-2000 weighbridge device license, and also provides support for unlimited CWCW-1001 weighbridge licenses.

Note: In this integration, individual weighbridges will require a CWCW-1001 license for each.



1.2.3 Weigh-Comm Specifications

1.3 Integration Components

All CathexisVision integrations have two component levels: **Device** and **Object**.

Device	The device is CathexisVision software's interface, which handles all the interaction between CathexisVision and the integrated hardware. When an integration is added to CathexisVision system, a device is added. The messages received from the device are of Device Events. Objects are the individual pieces of hardware that comprise the integration. There may multiple "object types" under the objects group. For example, the main controller and nodes of an access control system are both objects. They are different types of objects.

A NOTE ON CAMERA CHANNELS

The CathexisVision software packages have **limits on camera channels**. A multi-sensor camera is physically a single device (camera) but it requires a camera channel for each one of the internal cameras. The same applies to an encoder: a 16-channel encoder will account for 16 camera channels on the CathexisVision software, even though it is a single device. Even when a camera or device only uses a single IP license, the camera channel limit will still apply.



2. Features and Abilities

This section indicates the features/abilities of the Weigh-Comm Weighbridge software when integrated with CathexisVision.

2.1 General Device Features

- CathexisVision receives event messages from the Weigh-Comm Weighbridge device.
- The Weigh-Comm Weighbridge device sends messages to CathexisVision via a TCP or serial connection.
- The Weighbridge device object supports camera overlays.
- Device events can be used to trigger Cathexis Events

2.2 Device Objects

Objects are populated automatically as soon as communication between the Weigh-Comm Weighbridge device and CathexisVision is established.

2.3 Device Events

The CathexisVision Weigh-Comm Weighbridge integration generates device events, which are triggered on the device and reflected in CathexisVision.

2.4 Metadatabase

A unique metadatabase is created on the CathexisVision server for this integration. It is fully searchable, with configurable filters based on device event information (as above), and time stamping. The filtered event/s, and the associated video, will then be available for review in a new window from which an archive can be created and exported.

2.5 Maps

The CathexisVision GUI provides for configurable site maps that feature multi-layered, hierarchical, interactive interfaces providing representation and control of a site and its resources.

Map Action Triggers	 Device objects may be set to trigger a map action if the user left-clicks on map. The weighbridge device object may be set to trigger a map action if an On Event message is received from the device. All device objects may be set to perform a map action if any event occurs 	
30	 on the device. Device objects, which can be configured to trigger CathexisVision events, may also be set to perform a map action when specific CathexisVision events are triggered.
